*Comments: The proposed activities are realistic and feasible, providing a solid basis for implementation. Some elements, such as the activities with pending projects, will benefit from further clarification once funding is confirmed, offering an opportunity to refine the planning and ensure operational clarity.*

#### 3.1 Political issues addressed

*List issues: The Work Plan addresses key issues (climate change adaptation, natural hazard risk governance, and the socio-economic impacts of climate-related disasters). Further detailing of specific actions at the political level, however, would provide an opportunity to strengthen the policy impact and ensure full translation of these issues into political measures. And greater emphasis on the leadership role of regions — where they hold direct competences in risk governance and implementation — would further reinforce the political dimension in the domains where EUSALP has competences.*

#### 3.2 Suggestions for political action

*Comments: AG8's proposal presents a clear strategic vision, aiming to develop risk assessment methods aligned with EU frameworks, focusing on extreme, multi-hazard, and cascading events under climate change. It emphasizes the importance of effective risk governance instruments and the uptake of policy recommendations, as well as the mainstreaming of climate adaptation (CCA) and disaster risk reduction (DRR) into policies and funding frameworks.*

*The "Partially" rating reflects that detailed steps, retro-planning, and timelines are not yet defined, but the foundation for a strong action is well established.*

## Overall Conclusion

Based on the checklist, the following key points emerge and support a **positive assessment** of the Work Plan.

### Strengths

- Strong coherence with the EUSALP Action Plan and continuity with previous achievements, building on the key priorities identified in the recent AG8 policy recommendations.
- High policy relevance in light of increasing climate risks in the Alpine Region, with strong potential for policy uptake, scaling and synergies with EU frameworks, the Alpine Convention, Interreg projects and other Action Groups.

### Challenges

- Further clarification of operational task allocation among members will enhance implementation clarity and coordination
- Ensuring stable funding and consistent member engagement will help to maintain implementation capacity across all planned actions.
- Highlighting the comparative added value of AG8 vis-à-vis national DRM frameworks and further distinguishing between national prerogatives and regional coordination roles would strengthen the strategic focus of the Work Plan and avoid overlaps that may emerge at a later stage.
